

MONTHLY REPORT TO THE JUDICIAL AND LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE December 2016

1. Coroner's Office. The Coroner, Dara Hamm, has advised that a decedent that has no family does have about \$15,000 in liquid assets and, therefore, if a probate action were commenced the county could recover its \$750 cremation fees. I have arranged for private counsel to handle the case as there are sufficient funds to pay counsel, the burial related expenses incurred by the county, and then money left over to partially pay off the decedent's debts. The Coroner advises that these situations are becoming more common where there is no family available to make decisions or to take control of the estate of the decedent to pay the bills. I have advised that this office will handle the cases if there is enough money to recover the expenses of the Coroner's Office but not enough to compensate outside counsel and get the burial related expenses paid. If there are little or no assets whatsoever, then it won't be worth it for us to pursue the probate proceeding for the cremation expenses. A judgment call will be made on each case as to whether to proceed and if so, internally or externally.

The primary reason I bring this situation to your attention is to give you the ability to direct me to handle all such cases where there are sufficient assets to recover the cremation and burial costs. My thinking is that I don't want to compete with the private sector but that philosophy makes it much harder to raise revenues and alleviate the tax burden of this office. If you want to discuss the ability of this office to raise revenues in this type of case or with the much more lucrative guardianship and protective placement cases that are handled by both this office and the private sector, please let me know.

2. County Ordinances. As I have mentioned in the past, my proposed goals this year are geared around the recodification of the county's ordinances. My intention is to both assist other departments in their reviews and to also update the ten plus odd-ball ordinances that come under chapter 900. The ordinances in book form are about two inches thick and are organized by departments. Not every department has ordinances but those that do, like Sheriff, Health, Planning and Zoning, and so on, usually have a number of them. Ch. 900 consists of miscellaneous ordinances that don't fit well elsewhere so they all come under Corporation Counsel. What we don't have (and I am not advocating for or against, just advising) that some other governmental entities do have, are what might be called administrative ordinances. In lieu of that, Wood County has the Rules and Committees of the County Board which includes a listing of county departments and what they do. I'm kind of partial to our current setup of having the "rules" broken out from the ordinances as they seem more accessible to the supervisors and are simpler to modify as doing so only requires a resolution verses an ordinance (which must be published) but I have been here too long to be objective so I bring the matter to your attention to contemplate if you would like to have administrative type ordinances drafted for consideration. (I will provide the committee with the locations of examples from other counties.)
3. Goals. Although the committee hasn't formally set my goals as of this writing, I am working with the Health Dept. on a rewrite of Ordinance #300 Public Food Safety to bring it into conformance with the federal rules. Since the committee has stated a desire for updates on goals, I will try to provide one each month so you know what is transpiring. Part of that report will be an update of the attached summary of the status of the chapter 900 ordinances.

Ordinance Review Project – Chapter 900

Ordinance 900: Ethics. The Ethics committee met in the fall of 2016 and determined not to make any major revisions to the Ethics ordinance at that time. The committee will meet again in the late summer of 2017 and may then take action with respect to the contents of the ordinance.

Ordinance 901: Records Retention. The review of this ordinance is a major undertaking involving the assistance of all departments. My first step will be to review what other counties have done and changes in the law generally as it applies to the obligation of the county to retain its records.

Ordinance 902: Will Retention. The legal reference in the law is current and I am in the process of verifying with the Register in Probate that she is not looking for any changes.

Ordinance 903: Access to Public Records. I have reviewed the ordinance and it continues to reflect the statutory mandates applicable to the county. The county does have policies and procedures in place to comply with the ordinance/statute and those were updated and expanded upon a few years ago, No change is needed at this time.

Ordinance 904: Tax Deeded Land.

Ordinance 905: Dog Damage Claim.

Ordinance 906: Self-Organized County.

Ordinance 907: Clerk of Courts – Worthless Checks.

Ordinance 908: Over Payments and Under Payments.

Ordinance 909: Wood County Sales Tax.

Ordinance 910: Public Assistance Fraud.

Ordinance 911: currently unused. This had been the jury service ordinance but it was repealed in full on 10-9-10.

Ordinance 912: Filing & Recording Documents in the Register of Deeds Office.

Ordinance 913: Supervisory District Plan. Every ten years, after the decennial census, the county is obligated to revise its supervisory districts to reflect one-person one-vote and other prescribed community interests. These redistricting plans are approved by resolution per statute. However, when there is a redistricting during the decade resulting from a referendum to change the size of the county board, as occurred in Wood County in 2007, then the county board is required to enact an ordinance prescribing the revised boundaries of the new supervisory districts. Wis. Stat. s. 59.10(3)(cm)2. Since the supervisory districts have been revised via resolution since the 2007 modifications, the 2007 ordinance should be removed from the books as it doesn't reflect the current supervisory district boundaries. Therefore this ordinance will not be included in the recodified ordinances.

Below you will find a few county codes of ordinances that you may wish to view to compare and contrast to what Wood County has. Wood County's code of ordinances is accessible to the public on the county's web site under the county clerk's office's page.

Department heads are responsible for county owned personal property used by their staff. Personal property means all furniture, fixtures and equipment that had an original value of \$50 or more but does not include consumables.

- A. Acquisition of personal property. Department heads and their staff, to the extent it is within their position description, have the authority to acquire personal property for departmental use if the necessary funds have been budgeted. Acquisition of personal property is subject to procedures established by the Purchasing Dept. and approved by its oversight committee.
- B. Use of personal property. As set forth in the Ethics Code and Employee Policy Handbook, within reason, personal use of county property is prohibited. This does not mean that all incidental use of county property is barred, instead employee supervisors or department heads must approve of such incidental uses.
- C. Disposition of personal property. When there is no longer a need to retain personal property, a department head or their authorized designee has the following options:
 1. If the personal property has little or no value (or the value of the property is exceeded by the cost of exercising one of the other options) it may be placed in the garbage. A county employee may not retrieve items placed in the garbage or arrange for a third person to do so.
 2. If the personal property has sufficient value it may be:
 - a. Transferred to the Emergency Management Dept. for disposition pursuant to the policies of that department.
 - b. Turned over to a vendor for a credit on the acquisition of new personal property.
 - c. Transferred to a different county department.



- Scott Machotka from the Sheriff's Department came into the agency on November 10th to prepare us for the Active Shooter training exercise on December 6th.
- I will be attending the WCSEA board meeting on December 8th in Racine.
- I will be attending the Joint Legislative Committee meeting on December 12th.
- I will be working with Human Services on the Children First Program request in the coming weeks.
- The Department of Children and Families (DCF) has \$217,000 of funding that will be distributed to the counties based on partnerships they have formed with employment organizations. Once the request is released I will be working on detailing the plan we have formulated. We have been working on forming this partnership with Human Services and CW solutions over the last several years. I feel confident we will be able to earn additional funding in 2017. The \$217,000 will be distributed statewide so the amount Wood County may receive will not be earth shattering, but it will be helpful. I will keep you updated as we move through the process.
- As we move into 2017, I will be closely monitoring the State budget. The budget DCF submitted to the Governor's office leaves funding for the child support program intact. This is a good start but the process is far from over. I look forward to working with WCSEA, WCA and my oversight committee to ensure the budget process doesn't harm the child support program.
- I will be working on the cooperative agreements in the first part of December. With the implementation of e-filing, revenue will be decreasing to the Clerk of Courts. The revenue generated to the Family Court Commissioner decreased this year. The combination of increased collection rates and a more customer friendly approach have allowed the agency to reduce the number of cases going to court.
- The current IV-D case count is 3,965.

Charge Payment Fund: Payments received on outstanding charges.

Escrow Payment Fund: Customer money being held for future activity.

County Transfer Fee Fund: County retains 20% of all Transfer Fees collected.

County VitalChek Fee Fund: County retains \$10.00 from every person requesting a vital record online via Vitalchek.

Laredo Remote: County collects a fee from customers using Laredo software outside of the courthouse.

State DOA Fund: Signing of state budget bill 10/26/2007 increased birth certificates by \$8, marriage and death certificates by \$13.00, and the expedite fee by \$10.00. All monies to be mailed to the Department of Administration. The increase was enacted to come into compliance with recent federal laws. The monies will be used to automate outdated paper registration, archiving and copy issuance systems at the State and local vital records offices.

Reports Fund: County collects a fee (.50/page) from customers requesting reports.

Register of Deeds Fund: County retains all remaining recording fees (\$15.00 from each document recorded. \$5.00 from each first copy of every birth record sold. \$7.00 from each first copy of every death and marriage record sold. \$3.00 for each extra copy of vital records sold.)

County Land Record Fund: Effective June 25, 2010 statutes provide that \$8.00 is retained for the provision of land information on the internet and for Land Records modernization.

State Transfer Fund: State collects 80% of all Transfer Fees collected.

State Birth Fund: State collects \$7.00 of every birth record sold.

State Land Record Fund: State collects \$7.00 from each document recorded.

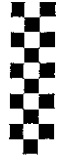
