REPORTED TO COMMITTEE: 6/13/2022

1. WARNING & COMMUNICATIONS

- a. A spill of 20 gallons of hydraulic oil was reported in the Village of Biron on 5/9/2022. Spill was caused by hydraulic line being hit. Sawdust has been spread onto the area, and then it will be placed into bins and disposed of.
- b. A spill of 800 gallons of fertilizer was reported in the Town of Richfield on 5/15/2022. Spill was caused by a tank being split open from the pressure of the product. Farmer reported he has a back hoe and bull dozer on site for cleanup.
- c. A spill of 20 gallons of effluent was reported in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on 5/16/2022. Spill was caused by the process sewer being backed up. Unknown at this time how much was actually released but 10-20 gallons reached the storm sewer. A mat was placed over the storm sewer once the backup was noticed and the rest of the release was vacuumed up.
- d. A spill of 3600 gallons of filtered water was reported in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on 5/26/2022. Spill was caused by sump pump failure. 7600 gallons spilled total, 3600 gallons made it to the river. A smaller pump is pumping contained water back into the building. Clean up also consisted of sand bags and gravel and dirt to soak up anything extra not allowing it to get to the river.
- e. A spill of 100 gallons of wastewater was reported in the City of Wisconsin Rapids on 5/26/2022. Spill was caused by sump pump being plugged causing an overflow. The spill has been contained and another sump pump will be installed into the process sewer. A mat/cover has been placed onto the affected storm drain.

- a. Received \$1,555.89 from FEMA for management costs for the 2019 July storm. This is the last of the grant money to be received from this grant.

By the time of the Public Safety Committee meeting, I expect to have a new deputy coroner on the south end and in training. With the current south end deputies wanting to step back, I will eventually be adding a second new south end deputy coroner.

Covid: While still low numbers, we are still seeing Covid 19 related deaths. Some of these cases are “incidental” findings. The person may be ill and go to the hospital and is found to have Covid during routine screening, but no signs of respiratory illness.

Thank you: I would like to thank Corey Schilling of Hansen-Schilling Funeral Home. When this office was given the van for use, we needed a tray to place in the back end. This tray is used to protect the vehicle from any leaking biohazards from any decedents we may transport. Mr. Schilling ordered one and donated it for our use.

Notes: (The notes below reflect to the categories above in the y-t-d)

1. This is the total combined deaths in Wood County as recorded by this office, both hospitals, all nursing homes, and all hospice agencies in Wood County.
2. These are the total number of calls for service for the Wood County Coroner's office when paged through dispatch. These are: scene calls, requests for cremation permits, hospice calls, follow up calls regarding cases and any other inquiries paged to us via dispatch. While this number may seem high, it is quite low. This is due to the fact most funeral homes we work with now have our personal cell phone numbers and call us directly for cremation permits.
3. This is the total number of deaths due to natural causes that are signed by this office. These include scene deaths, both hospital deaths (Marshfield Medical and Aspirus Riverview) that occur in their respective Emergency Rooms, some hospital deaths where the decedent has been admitted less than 24 hours, any case where the State of WI has rejected the physician's cause of death and referred the case to our coroner's office and, lastly, any case where the signing physician is unable or unwilling to sign the cause and manner of death.
4. This, unfortunately, is our elderly population. Most of these falls result in the fracture of a major bone such as hip, spine, or femur. This typically results in inanition/failure to thrive syndrome with the individual. This period from time of injury until death can be weeks to months. Occasionally, traumatic injuries are so severe that death happens rapidly. This is usually due to closed head injury or chest and abdominal injuries.
5. Clearly, the numbers of Covid related deaths are down. For May, there was only one Covid related death with symptoms. The remainder were individuals admitted to hospitals for other reasons and upon routine testing, were found to be Covid positive with no symptoms. With federal government subsidies available for funeral expenses with deaths associated with Covid, I spoke with Dr Corliss about listing these cases with Covid as causes of death. His recommendation was to list the primary cause of death, as per the medical records, and under contributing factors, list the Covid infection. I agree with

this as it saves Wood County money in that we will not be performing autopsies on these individuals to determine the extent of what their Covid infection played in their demise.

6. While typically motor vehicle accidents (autos), this also includes motorcycle accidents and in May, includes a pedestrian vs. motor vehicle.

7. With the many recreational activities found in Wood County, I felt obligated to have this as its own category. Further, when Wood County began allowing UTV's to operate on public roadways, I thought we might see an influx in accidents related to these vehicles. While still relatively new, we have not seen the influx in accidents I was expecting with regards to these types of vehicles.

8. While this category is self-explanatory (suicides), I have chosen to only list the numbers of suicide related deaths and not the manner it is accomplished. Unfortunately, the manner is often dictated by circumstance, available means, amount of despair and ultimately the sex of the individual.

9. Again, this category is self-explanatory. Looking back in previous cases, we don't have many cases of homicide on record. When we do have a homicide case or suspected homicide case, a forensic autopsy will be conducted and the case reported to you, with respect to the amount of details I can provide at that given time depending on the status of the investigation.

10. Overdoses fall into two categories – intentional and accidental, with respect to manner of death. Intentional would be considered a suicide. Accidental is a true “accident” as in the person took too many prescribed medications that took their life. More commonly, “accidental” involves the use of illicit drugs. With respect to the cases, out of the current 7 listed, only 1 is due to suicide. The remaining 6 are due to illicit street drugs, most commonly involving Fentanyl.

11. The “other” category is a “catch all” category for deaths that do not fit into any of the listed categories. For March, we had three of these reported and confirmed deaths. One was a foreign body airway obstruction (choking) and the other two were due to hypothermia. The hypothermia were two cases in which the elderly individuals became locked out of their residences and succumbed due to the cold temperatures they were exposed to. The April

case is that of an individual who was involved in a house fire and ultimately expired due to carbon monoxide poisoning.

12. This is the total number of death certificates signed by our office by month. These include, but are not limited to, scene death investigations, hospital ER deaths, deaths “kicked back” to our agency by the state, calls received by funeral homes and any death not signed by a physician.

13. This is the total amount of cremation permits signed by our office. This is in comparison to the total number of deaths in Wood County. Currently, cremations far exceed the “traditional burial.” With the current total number of deaths at 588, 72% are cremations. This number is higher than the forecasted national average, but this is on par with the current trend overall. It is expected this number will only continue to increase in the future.

14. Out of the seven autopsies performed this year, only two have been out of medical necessity. The remaining five have been in the cases of possible drug overdoses. All but one of these five autopsies have no “competing causes” for death in the individual meaning that except for the use of drugs, the decedent was healthy. These autopsies are performed in the hopes that with good investigations by law enforcement, an individual may be prosecuted for the delivery of the illicit substances. The one individual was found to have significant cardiovascular disease, but the death was still attributed to illicit drugs based on toxicology. I foresee the number of autopsies increasing simply due to the fact the number of drug related deaths are on the rise.

5-8,9; WC8112, anonymous complainant reported to Dispatch that a person was letting his dog eat his kittens. Dispatch had provided me with the suspects first name, middle initial, and last name, alsong with an address on the 'Call for Service' sheet that was emailed to me. I was not advised that this suspect is in anyway potentially dangerous nor listed as '*use caution*'.

For safety reasons I decided to look up the subject on CCAP (Wisconsin Circuit Court Access) to see if there was a history of prior cases that were of concern. There were no prior cases listed under that name. So I put in the subjects first initial "J" instead of his full first name (Jared), along with his last name. I found the subject at this address but with a different spelling of his first name; the correct spelling on CCAP is Jarrod, not Jared.

Concerns are: that he has eight criminal charges including bail jumping and a current/open case of Possess Firearm-Convicted of a Felony.

After learning of the suspects history, I knew that I and Humane Officer Baierl should bring deputies with us when we go to his house. So I called Dispatch to arrange a time that we could meet deputies at the address. I also gave dispatch *Jarrod* as the correct spelling of his first name, when the dispatcher looked him up with the correct spelling they told me that he is listed as a "10-0, Use Caution". I was also told that they have record of him threatening officers, and that they will have to kill him if they try to arrest him, threats to state patrol, threats to buy a gun and that he has a mannequin filled with explosives (Tannerite), that he says he is a 'Sovereign Citizen'

Humane Officer Baierl, myself and two deputies met up near the address, we saw the suspect was walking outside in his yard, one of the deputies talked with him and advised that I wanted to speak with him. The suspect did walk over to us, and after asking a few questions he did deny that he let his dog eat the kittens, yet blamed his roommates for calling dispatch on him. The suspect would not let us into his house.

Had I not had the intuition to look this suspect up on CCAP, Humane Officer Brooke Baierl and myself would have gone to the residence alone, knocked on this door, explained the concerns of the complaint and have asked to go inside to check the welfare of any remaining kittens; we would have been placed in a potentially dangerous situation.

Security Services screened 5,461 people entering the courthouse for the month. Security Services had 28 security requests from different departments within the Courthouse.

On May 16th Security Services responded to branch 2 for a male subject having seizures. The ambulance was paged but the subject refused transportation after coming out of his seizure. Later that same day we were called to the third floor for a disorderly subject being loud and argumentative. When we arrived, the situation calmed and the subject left without incident.

On May 19th, a subject entered the courthouse and went up to the third floor. Security Services was notified that the subject possibly had multiple warrants out for his arrest. We looked into the situation and did confirm that he had several warrants. The man was taken into custody without incident.

I did utilize part-time employees for 10.25 hours this month. These part-time hours are all training hours for the part-timer employees.
