Remarks: I would like to take this opportunity to thank Scott Brehm for the work that he completed for the Coroner's office. Scott was able to solidify policies and practices to ensure that the citizens of Wood County receive quality service. Additionally, I would like to thank all staff in the County for their patience and assistance during this transition.

Of another note, the coroner's office had utilized a pager system for notification. This pager system has shown increasing defectiveness over the last few months and became non-operational on Friday of

Memorial Day weekend. With assistance from the Wood County Dispatch Center, the coroner's office was able to make a rapid transition through a system known as "I am Responding". Not only will this system provide prompt notification of needed service, it will also reduce cost to the County by eliminating the pager system. This system has been in use with multiple agencies in the county and has proven as a trusted and reliable notification system.

Lastly, we are hopeful that a new Coroner will be appointed soon. In the meantime, please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns.



Option #4	Outsource the position to an Independent Contractor.

The miscellaneous items that were located for the month were an empty holster, a window punch, scissors, a skateboard and a tab of acid.

The tab of acid was located on the floor by the screening equipment. Security Services reviewed the cameras but were unable to identify who had dropped the illegal substance.

Security Services screened 6,770 people entering the courthouse for the month. We handed out 138 masks to individuals coming into the courthouse for court. Security Services also had 41 security requests from different departments within the Courthouse.

For the month of May Security Services located two wallets found on the grounds and in the courthouse. One wallet was located in the parking lot and the other was in a third floor bathroom. Both wallets were returned to their owners.

Security Services also helped an individual who had locked her keys in her vehicle. We were able to unlock the vehicle for her and send her on her way.

On May 26, 2021, the courts lifted their mask mandate for the courtrooms. The only exception is for jury trials. All jurors will still have to wear masks.

During the Month of May, I did utilize part-time employees for 135.5 hours to fill employee shortage hours.
